As Minister of Ecology of the host country, I wish the Forum of Marseille to focus on concrete solutions enabling rapid progress in terms of access to water and to sanitation.

I also wish that commitments are taken by the different categories of stakeholders to ensure that progresses are achieved.

The debates and outcomes should be guided by certain principles:

- Efficiency requires that all involved parties are closely associated not only in the management of water in general but also in the preparation of the Forum.
- The role of local authorities is essential to improve access to water and sanitation. Good quality water has a considerable impact on human health.
- The protection of water resources is an obligation for all of us, both in terms of quantity and of quality.
- Finally, by strengthening transboundary cooperation around a shared resource, we contribute to peace.

The mobilisation of all the stakeholders and their participation in the Forum will be the guarantee of the progress of these principles, at the service of humanity.

This is key to sustainable development, to the fight against poverty, to the protection of the environment and often, to peace and security. Crucially, the challenge primarily concerns countries that top the French agenda in terms of development assistance, such as Sub–Saharan African countries.

The World Water Forum in Marseille is an opportunity to promote the commitment of all in the fight for access to water and sanitation: nations, local governments, but also associations, NGOs and businesses. It will also help improve the quantitative and qualitative management of water resources, the role of local and regional authorities, and transboundary cooperation.

The Forum of Marseille is an opportunity for France to demonstrate its strong commitment on this issue.

The stakes are high: after Marseille, conditions must be met for the whole world to have access to safe water.

Alain Juppé Ministre d'Etat, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs Overcoming cycles of drought and the arid nature of our region Provence, providing water for everyone, taking into account demographic growth, evacuating and treating this water while ensuring its quality and safety, fighting the risks of flooding... these are just some of the challenges that Marseille and the region's local authorities make efforts to control so as to give each inhabitant the fundamental right to water... a right which is from now on universally acknowledged, for providing water means ensuring life, health and food, economic and social vitality, development and harmony.

For close to one hundred and sixty years, the local public and private stakeholders have developed an internationally recognised expertise and built an infrastructure to supply, treat and distribute water, among the most effective in the world. Our institutions also learnt a long time ago how to manage this precious resource consensually, making our region a famous pole of excellence, where laboratories and businesses at the service of sustainable development flourish.

In this context, what could be more legitimate for our region than to host the largest global meeting for water in March 2012? Particularly since this ambition and the requirement have been consolidated with time.

Today, the PACA Regional Council supports local action in sanitation, resources and the management of the aquatic environment, and more particularly dealing with flooding. The Marseille Provence Métropole Urban Community is responsible for water and sanitation in its eighteen municipalities and will open the doors to its installations to conference participants and visitors to the Forum, for them to see their cutting edge quality control and resource protection facilities.

Since 1982, the Bouches du Rhône General Council has been responsible for the development, maintenance and operation of water courses, lakes and other State-owned bodies of water, whilst the City of Marseille manages the problem of rainwater run-off and the Marseille Provence Chamber of Commerce and Industry brings the support of the business world and enhances the competence of French and regional companies in the water domain.

To this range of expertise and the many solutions implemented in Marseille and its region, we have to add the 26 centuries of exchanges with the world and a flawless determination to promote international cooperation. Indeed, the "Provençal water model" can be shared, particularly with our neighbours on the shores of the Mediterranean.

The City of Marseille, which initiated, proposed and defended the candidature of Marseille as host to the 6th World Water Forum, is particularly proud to have been chosen to organise this major event for the future of humanity, alongside France and the World Water Council. It is for this reason that it has been consecrated "World Water Capital 2012".

Host city to the World Water Council since its creation, Marseille implements an ambitious water policy with an eye on the future and all those who would like to contribute to its cause are welcome to come and join us to share, exchange, listen and debate the best solutions to be put in motion.

The Ministerial Declaration

is being prepared through a series of Preparatory Committee meetings (PrepComs) by national governments in consultation with Major Groups, international organisations and the thematic/regional coordinators of the Forum.

Regional **Trialogues**

will be organised among Ministers, Parliamentarians and Local/Regional Authorities. These Trialogues will be based on targets selected by the regions themselves and discussed as to how each level of government can help the other in their implementation and whether improved multi-level governance mechanisms would aid in achieving their solutions.

High Level Roundtables

will be convened by one or more countries during the Forum, which facilitate an in-depth dialogue with ministers and representatives from intergovernmental organisations, civil society, the private sector, academia and local and parliamentary elected officials.

- A roadmap to achieve concrete commitments, involving experts and decision–makers from different sectors and regions of the world.
